

# Important information about the questionnaire

This document is the master version of the core questionnaire and includes numerous notes and guidelines for the project partners and the polling institutes they work with. In order to ensure the quality, comparability, and compatibility of the surveys across all countries and to facilitate the data processing, it is imperative that all partners adhere to the procedures listed below.

- 1. All partners must ask *all* of the questions included in the core questionnaire. Should your budget allow for additional questions, this may only be done following the completion of the core questionnaire. Do not omit questions from the core questionnaire.
- 2. The numbering and order of the questions as listed here in the core questionnaire may not be altered. Unless otherwise noted, this also applies to the items and the response categories: Do not omit or add answer categories.
- 3. If you add additional questions or modules after completing the core questionnaire, new questions must be given new numbers not already in use in the core questionnaire. New response items, such as an additional country-specific education category, must be given a label or number not already used by the core questionnaire.
- 4. Translated questionnaires must mirror the typography of the master version. Words and phrases in **boldface** or *italic* type must also be in boldface or italic type in the translated versions. Likewise, the translations may not include words in boldface or italic type that were not so formatted in the master version.

# Notes on the survey

Throughout the survey, you will find numerous notes and guidelines to be used in translation, survey implementation, and online programming. These notes are not part of the question text and are delineated through the use of brackets: []

- For example, the [filters] are denoted using [yellow highlighted text within brackets].
- [Red text within brackets] indicates that a question or item needs to be adjusted, for example, for country-specific items, grammatical tense (is vs. was). The [country-specific] and [your country] note appear frequently and signal that the question must be adapted for use in their respective countries. In some cases, additional information is given to what is meant by country-specific.

- Notes relating to the programming of the online questionnaire are [italicized within brackets]. For example, when respondents are able to enter in a number, a suggested range of accepted numerical responses is given.
- [Yellow, italic text within brackets] is used to signify that a question block will be randomized so that respondents are not influenced by the order in which questions are presented.
- Other notes with [text within brackets] denote question block titles or refer to the question source, when applicable. For example, partners should consult the survey sources listed when translating into the target language.




